- *Summary*: In my dissertation, I develop a general theory of the effect of education on democratic values and political participation, as well as the policy implications of these effects on the possibility of authoritarian reversal and democratic consolidation. Assessing conditions under which transitional states experience authoritarian reversal or democratic consolidation, I find that increasing educational attainment decreases the likelihood of authoritarian reversal and promotes the survival of democracy. I also address how education has a positive influence on citizens’ democratic values, regardless of subnational regime type, by analyzing Mexican public opinion data. I investigate the explanations of voter turnout in the U.S. by focusing on the effect of generation and education. Contrary to existing studies, I demonstrate that voter turnout has remained relatively static by examining data over a longer time span from 1960 to 2012. I show that there is no generational effect on voter turnout. Also, I demonstrate that the positive effect of education on turnout diminishes over time. In particular, the effect of education is not statistically significant in the 2000s. Finally, the absolute value of education is not offset by the relative value of education.
