Your FAFSA was selected for review in a process called “verification.” In this process, your school will be comparing information from your application with signed copies of your (and your spouse’s, if you are married) 2014 Federal Tax Forms, or a 2014 Wage and Income Transcript or other financial documents. The law says we have the right to ask you for this information before awarding Federal aid. If there are differences between your application information and your financial documents, you or your school may need to make corrections electronically or by using your Student Aid Report (SAR).
