Job Description	<p>The Forensic Interviewer interviews children alleged to be victims of sexual abuse, severe child maltreatment, or witnesses to violent crimes which are referred to The Children's Assessment Center by either Law Enforcement or Children's Protective Services. Forensic Interviewers are trained to Interview children in a supportive, child-friendly, and non-leading way, while the investigators involved view the interview which is digitally recorded to preserve the child's disclosure and demeanor, minimizing the number of times the child is interviewed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Builds and maintains strong working relationships with investigative case workers and law enforcement officers to ensure a collaborative investigation process.• Coordinates interviews of children with the Children's Protective Services and Law Enforcement.• Maintains flexibility in work schedule due to constraints on partner agencies with priority investigations and emergency situations to ensure provision of services.• Adjusts interviews to fit a child's developmental needs.• Assesses child's verbal and non-verbal communication for signs of sexual abuse.• Documents written summaries and assessments of completed interviews.• Consistently obtains pertinent information that assists civil and criminal investigations of child abuse.• Attends Multi-Disciplinary Case staffing's to discuss disclosures.• Attends local, regional and national trainings on interviewing children and child abuse to maintain current knowledge of best practices and latest research on interviewing.• Participates in local, regional and national Peer Review and stays up-to date on current literature to maintain a high level of interviewing skills.• Testifies as an expert witness in civil and criminal court regarding interviewing children and disclosures.• Provides training on dynamics of sexual abuse, The CAC and interviewing.• Documents interviews and relevant information in the Case Tracking System.
