Services are aimed at stabilization and easing resumption of normal life, thereby preventing pathological consequences of potentially traumatic situations.</li> <li>Works collaboratively with caregivers and the multidisciplinary team from initial investigation through resolution of the child's case.</li> <li>Builds rapport with the non-offending caregiver during th initial visit to The CAC in order to conduct a thorough needs assessment and to ensure understanding of investigative processes and dynamics of sexual abuse.</li> <li>Provides some case management and resource linkage to ensure child has access to medical, mental health, educational, and legal services.</li> <li>Conducts assessments, diagnostics, and treatment through individual, family, and group therapy, supportive counseling, crisis intervention, psycho-education, and resource coordination.</li> <li>Provides community outreach, professional presentations and other duties as assigned.</li> <li>Engages children and families of all ages, ethnicities, genders, and socioeconomic backgrounds to restore and enhance psychosocial functioning of individuals and families adversely affected by child abuse/trauma.</li> </ul>
