

MISSION:

To create leaders in the field of Autism Spectrum and other Neurodevelopmental Disabilities (ASD/ND) through a year-long interdisciplinary training program focusing on leadership development, cultural competence and evidence-based practice

ELIGIBLE CANDIDATES:

- · Currently enrolled graduate students at an accredited institution of higher education at the Master's or Doctorate level
- Professionals employed part or full time whose focus of profession is within one of the Core Disciplines (see box).
- · Parents and siblings of individuals with developmental disabilities
- Adults with a diagnosed developmental disability



CURRICULUM:

- Didactic Seminars: presented by experts in the area of ASD representing the 14 Core and Additional Disciplines.
- Clinical Practica: Observation and participation in all aspects of care for children with ASD/ND at sites in the greater Houston area.
- Research: Individual research project supervised by LEND faculty, resulting in poster presentation at annual LEND conference and potential manuscript preparation.
- Additional: Leadership development workshops and team project, conference attendance, interdisciplinary interactions, and a family mentorship experience.
