<b>Job Description</b>	<p>Victim/Prevention Advocate provides culturally competent programming to promote prevention of sexual and domestic violence through community mobilization, educational and community outreach activities to increase exposure of agency and raise awareness about domestic and sexual violence. Participate in local, regional and statewide training addressing primary prevention of sexual and domestic violence. Conduct community outreach to organizations such as, but not limited to, community agencies, elementary, middle and high schools, alternative school settings, local businesses, and other anti-violence agencies in Brazoria county to reduce beliefs, attitudes and behaviors that support sexual violence. Assess outcomes of prevention programming by providing pre/post instruments (i.e. verbal/written surveys, tests and evaluations) to provide on-going development of activities and strategies for prevention. Manage educational data collected from presentations, fairs and trainings to prepare monthly, quarterly and annual reports to ensure grant compliance with designated funders. Provide intervention services to survivors of domestic and sexual violence including peer support services, crisis intervention, court accompaniment, filing of crime victim compensation applications, employment search support, housing info and referral, protective order assistance and connecting survivors to all community and state resources as needed. Work as scheduled and act as on-call advocate (including overnight and weekend hours) to survivors of domestic and sexual violence at local hospitals. Keep abreast of current incidents of sexual and domestic violence by researching internet and local newspapers.</p>
<b>Qualifications</b>	<p>Bachelor's Degree in Psychology, Sociology, Women's Studies, Social Work or equivalent experience in social service work. Bilingual English/Spanish highly desired, not required. Knowledge of the dynamics of sexual and domestic violence. Demonstrated ability to facilitate educational group sessions and make public presentations. Demonstrated ability to develop, implement and monitor culturally competent programming to youth and adults. Ability to work flexible schedule. Must pass criminal background</p>
