Research Assistant. Hired to coordinate Dr. Danielle Parrish's NIH, NIDA B/START (R03) funded research project, CHOICES-TEEN: A Bundled Risk Reduction Intervention for Juvenile Justice Females. This study aims to adapt and assess the feasibility of the CHOICES intervention in reducing the risk of HIV nicotine-exposed pregnancy and alcohol-exposed pregnancy with high-risk adolescent females on intensive juvenile probation. Duties include preparing materials for implementation of project, participating in facilitating a focus group for feedback on measures and intervention, conducting initial screenings and assessments with participants, and managing data collection.

Hired to coordinate Dr. McClain Sampson's research project, Prevention of Postpartum Depression: Development of a Home-visiting Intervention for Low-Income, Culturally Diverse Expectant Mothers funded by a University of Houston New Faculty Research Grant. This study aimed to develop and examine implementation of a brief, home visiting, intervention for mothers who are at risk for developing postpartum depression (PPD). Duties included communication with agency staff, tracking progress of project goals, assisting with revision of Institutional Review Board application, and training new staff to use the Motivational Interviewing, and Problem Solving Tools techniques used in the project.
