“TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUE”: TRUST, HUMANISTIC AI, AND HUMANITIES HIGHER EDUCATION

As generative AI joins other social ambient conditions that produce uncertainties, there is growing skepticism in higher education that regards AI as either an inherently unethical tool or disruption to personalized learning. How does trust form between educators and students and between users and AI tools, and how does AI's trustworthiness inform ethical action? Trust is currently grounded in the accuracy of large language models' (LLM) concept reproduction similar to the operation of a xerox machine. However, trust is a human-centered, relational concept. In complex domains that are rife with uncertainties and opaque situations, trust emerges from gaining agency and access to processes.
