Course Description

An introductory-level course provides a general survey of Asian Religions, including Hinduism, Buddhism, Jainism, Sikhism, Taoism, Confucianism, and Shintoism. Students will examine the history, texts, rituals, and community of each religious and philosophical tradition.

This course will: Enhance students' knowledge of Asian religions • Refine students' view about religious issues, both from personal and sociological perspectives • Provide students an understanding required to analyze, compare, and contrast religious practices of the same religion in different countries • Offer students knowledge of aspects that shape the evolution of religions in Asian countries.

No background knowledge about any of these traditions is required.
