Types of Adult AR Available

Both individual and group AR services are available at USLHC. These services are provided by graduate students in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders, under the supervision of a licensed and certified speech-language pathologist.

AR therapy groups provide participants with the tools needed to increase hearing and communication skills, as well as to help develop realistic expectations.

The Focus of Adult AR

- Develop effective listening strategies
- Increase comprehension of speech by improving discrimination of sounds
- Increase comprehension of speech in noisy environments
- Learn to use equipment hearing aids, cochlear implant, FM system etc.
- Improve speech reading/lip reading skills



What is Adult Aural Rehabilitation?

The goal of aural rehabilitation (AR) is to help people adjust to hearing loss and learn to use residual hearing in activities of daily life. This can include many services including increasing communication and hearing skills, developing listening strategies, and learning to make the best use of hearing aids, cochlear implants, or other devices.

Participation in aural rehabilitation and speech reading programs has been shown to increase motivation and compliance in using amplification such as hearing aids or cochlear implants. Research shows the group environment helps develop realistic expectations.
