

# Services for Adults and Children at the USLHC

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## Hearing Evaluations

Evaluations to determine the type and severity of hearing loss are administered by a certified and licensed audiologist and are available to adults and children ages 2 and older. Medical referrals to doctors who specialize in ear disorders are provided when necessary.

## Hearing Evaluations/Consultations

Evaluations and consultations are available to adults and children ages 2 and older. Recommendations for amplification are made based on the type and severity of hearing loss.

## Aural Rehabilitation Services

Listening with amplification can be challenging at first and may require some time to adjust. Training provided to manage a hearing loss includes informational counseling, speech reading, listening strategies, adjustment to amplification, and speech and language activities.

## Hearing Screenings

Community and clinic-based hearing screenings for children and adults are provided by graduate students under the supervision of a certified and licensed audiologist or speech-language pathologist.



## Hearing Aid Assistance Program

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The Hearing Aid Assistance Program is a program provided by the USLHC and the United Way. Hearing evaluations and hearing aids are available at a greatly reduced cost to low-income persons who need hearing aids through funding from the United Way.

## The Benefits of Aural Rehabilitation

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- Informational counseling is provided to the client and family/caregiver to encourage self-advocacy as they adjust to using their amplification.
- Participation in aural rehabilitation and speech reading programs has been shown to increase motivation and compliance in using amplification such as hearing aids or cochlear implants.

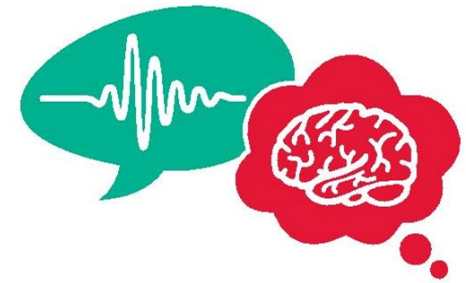
