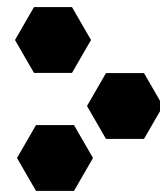
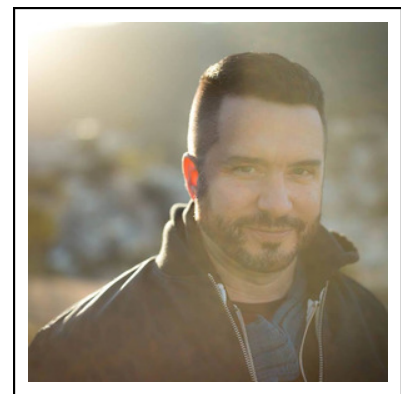


# THUG LOVE
