Also, please note that if you will not have your thesis or dissertation ready by the Fall deadline of December 3, 2004, you may request a two week extension by completing a General Petition form. Do not forget to apply for Fall graduation by September 17, 2004; even if you filed last semester you will need to reapply for this semester. ## What's New In Research

### Anxiety and Depression Clinics at PRSC

**Drs. Peter Norton, Jeremy Pettit, and Lynn Rehm**, in conjunction with a number of graduate student volunteers, have started specialty services in the Psychological Research and Services Center (PRSC) for individuals with depression or anxiety. Existing for treatment provision, research, and clinical training, the Anxiety and Depression Clinics (ADC) began recruiting clients in Spring 2004. Currently both anxiety and depression treatment groups are underway, and another round of publicity and referral seeking is planned for early in Fall 2004.

The National Organization of Oral History has asked **Dr. Richard Evans** to give the keynote address, on his dialogues with well-known psychologists, at the organization's upcoming annual meeting in Portland, OR.

**Dr. Dale Johnson** was elected president of the New Mexico National Alliance for the Mentally Ill (NAMI). It has 350 members in about 12 cities, and Dr. Johnson will work to expand membership. He also plans to contact 31 Community Mental Health Centers to make sure they meet the state recommendation that they use evidence based treatment and include families.

The fellows committee of the International Society of Clinical Psychology (ISCP) has named **Dr. Lynn Rehm** a Charter Fellow of ISCP.
