Women's, Gender & Sexuality Studies Major

WGSS / University of Houston

The Women's, Gender, & Sexuality Studies (WGSS) Major, draws upon the dynamic energy of the global city of Houston, Texas, and the great diversity of the University of Houston campus. The major promotes an intersectional, multidisciplinary and transnational approach that critically assesses existing hierarchies, inequalities, and forms of privilege. The major also challenges students to understand how categories of gender, sexuality, race, class, dis/ability, and citizenship shape not only their own lives but also the lives of people in their communities and around the world. The program's strength comes from the diversity of the perspectives it draws from, including faculty affiliates from 14 different disciplines as well as a deep engagement with communities and organizations in Houston.

The 30 hour major consists of the following:

- I. 3 hours in Intro to Women's Studies (WGSS 2350) or Intro to GLBT Studies (WGSS 2360)
- II. 3 hours in Gender, Society & Feminist Theory (WGSS 3350) or Theory, Sexuality & Queer Theory (WGSS 3360)
- III. 3 hours in Issues in Feminist Research (WGSS 4350)
- IV. 3 hours in Capstone Internship Course (WGSS 4360)*
- V. 3 hours in Gender in Transnational Perspective (WGSS 3321) or Intersectionalities (WGSS 3322)
- VI. 15 hours in cross-listed advance course electives (3300 or above) from approved course list**

At least $\underline{21}$ of the 30 hours must be taken in residence. A maximum of 9 hours of approved transfer substitutes will be accepted toward the major. A minimum of C (2.00) is required for a course to count toward the major, and a minimum 2.00 grade point average is required for the major.

The interdisciplinary nature of this Major requires that students not confine to any one department or college. WGSS is housed in the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences and located in Agnes Arnold Hall (624 AH).
