

FY17 College Research Expenditures Per Ranked Faculty >100k







FY17 Department Research Expenditures – Top 20








FY17 Department Research Expenditures – Top 10






FY17 Department Research Expenditures per Ranked Faculty





Research Expenditures Per Faculty Rank - Overall










Assistant Professors – Contracts vs. No Contracts Engineering




