

UH CAMP provides first-year* university students who have migrant or agricultural work backgrounds with the tools and support to begin their undergraduate studies at the University of Houston.

Program Benefits



On-campus housing, meal plan and stipend



Academic, professional and personal workshops



Personalized tutoring and mentorship

Program Requirements

- » Student or an immediate family member has:
 - » Evidence of history of enrollment or current participation in the Migrant Education Program (MEP) anytime during K-12 OR
 - Evidence that the student or his/her parent(s) or legal guardian(s) has worked in migrant or seasonal farm work for at least 75 days in the past 24 months OR
 - » Participated in the National Farmworker Jobs Program (NFJP) or been deemed eligible to participate
- » Must be admitted to UH
 - » Minimum GPA of 3.0 OR
 - » Minimum SAT of 1080/Minimum ACT of 21
- » Enroll at UH as a full-time student (12 credit hours)
- » Be a U.S. citizen or U.S. legal permanent resident
- » Complete FAFSA application
- » Required to participate in UH CAMP seminars and workshop series

*Some students with previous or current college credits may be eligible to apply. Contact our office for more information.
