Approval of Minutes: September 14, 2022 Meeting

Minutes of the September 14, 2022 meeting were approved as distributed.

Special Presentation by Faculty Senate President: David Shattuck

FS Pres. David Shattuck presented a plaque recognizing Dr. Jeronimo Cortina for his service on the Senate (2016-2022).

Report from and Discussion with the University of Houston System Chancellor and University of Houston President: <u>Renu Khator</u>

- President Renu Khator thanked everyone and expressed her appreciation. From the earlier discussion she heard during the Provost's updates, Pres. Khator explained the two types of funding sources UH draws its finances (state and tuition) and what the repercussions of decreased enrollment can affect the university. She commented that he university is struggling to improve its funding situation
 - UH has requested from the state legislature a separate fund of \$1B.
 - There will be funding from the Big 12 Conference (subsidy for Athletics will be reduced).
- Pres. Khator said that she will continue to emphasize the three main points from her fall address: 1) 70% graduation rate, 2) \$400M goal in research expenditures, 3) \$1B separate state fund to propel UH towards the goal of top 50 public university.
- Lastly, Pres. Renu Khator encouraged senators to support UH Football an Basketball by attending the games.

Report from the University of Houston System Interim Senior Vice Chancellor and University of Houston Interim Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost: <u>Robert McPherson</u>

- The Provost Office in consultation with the General Counsel's office has completed the review of the Enhanced Performance Evaluation policy.
- The non-tenured track salary survey that was requested by the Faculty Senate is completed
 - The 50,000 ft view of this process is 2/3 of our promotion eligible faculty are at 90% or above 95% or above the national average. The report will be made public on the website Academic Affairs is focusing on ways improve the graduation rates for undergraduate students by observing how quickly students can move and progress through an academic degree program. Will work closely with the department chairs and program directors on this task. The deans are already evaluating some of this information to see what can be done to streamline and enhance the capacity of students who progress through a degree program.

Report from and Discussion with the University of Houston System Senior Vice Chancellor and University of Houston Senior Vice President for Administration and Finance: Raymond Bartlett

- UH is involved in continued discussions with Metro on the bus rapid transit project which is scheduled to start in 2025 and to be completed in 2027.
- Capital projects that are underway are over \$750 million. SVP Raymond Bartlett will present some highlights of the major capital projects at the next meeting.
- The next UH home game is scheduled on October 29th. There will be a faculty/staff tailgate and encouraged the senators to attend.

Report from and Discussion with the University of Houston System Interim Vice Chancellor and University of Houston Interim Vice President for Research: <u>Claudia Neuhauser</u>

- DoR staffing (specifically OCG) is still in progress and hope to fill most of the positions by the end of the year.
- Focusing on core facilities. DoR has regular meetings with Facilities, Planning & Construction. The groups are identifying what needs to be renovated and what space to build. Equipment purchase is prioritized.
- DoR is focusing on reaching the goal of expanding UH's research expenditures to \$400M. The division is looking at more funding opportunities for researchers. She encouraged senators to reach out to her or the DoR staff for suggestions, questions, etc.

SACSCOC Fifth-Year Interim Report by Director of Institutional Effectiveness, Assessment, and Accreditation and SACSCOC Liaison: <u>Monique Baucham</u>

- The steering committee was launched earlier in July.
- The University of Houston is accredited by the <u>Southern Association of Colleges and Schools</u> <u>Commission on Colleges</u> to award baccalaureate, master's, professional and doctoral degrees Contact the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges. The focus is making sure that they're (accreditors) all communicating together, and identifying any areas where tweaking is needed to make sure that we're in compliance with the University (6) Reports & Key performance metrics:
 - Twenty -two standards are addressed on the following:
 - Faculty
 - Student Services
 - Financial Aid
 - Academic program coherence and rigor
 - Key Performance Metrics (retention rate, graduation rate, licensure/board scores, number of graduate degrees awarded)
 - Report is due on March 2024.

Presentation on Optional Retirement Plans by University of Houston System Associate Vice Chancellor and University of Houston Associate Vice President for Human Resources: <u>Gaston</u> <u>Reinoso</u>

- AVP Gaston Reinoso gave a presentation on –ORP and Tax-Deferred Annuity Plans which focused on:

- The committee worked hard to improve the ORP program. It has been streamlined and saved millions of dollars in faculty and staff accounts. HR will continue to push forth with that effort.

Report from and Discussion by Faculty Senate President: David Shattuck

FS Pres. Dave Shattuck welcomed everyone. He expressed his appreciation for faculty members effort for their attendance in person. He also reported on the following items:

- Faculty and staff tailgate homecoming game scheduled on October 29th
- A new version of the Faculty Senate website is forthcoming. FS Pres. Shattuck commented that staff members are working very hard to get this new website up and running.
- Faculty Senate meeting style: All meetings will be hybrid. FS Pres. David Shattuck's main focus is to increase engagement in Senate meetings both remotely and in-person beginning next month.
- FS Pres. David Shattuck gave a summary of the process status timeline for the post tenure review policy revision proposal. His expectations of this process is that the FAC will receive revisions based on the feedback and the EC will have a formal vote. Secondly, it will go to the Board of Regents to review and approve by December 1st with the expectation that there will an implementation for the calendar year 2023 reviews. Q&A session followed.
