Virtual Workshop Series: Making your Scholarly Work Visible with ORCID.

This workshop series is for all graduate students involved in research. ORCID (Open Researcher and Contributor ID) provides a free, unique, and persistent identifier for students, postdocs, and faculty engaged in research. Your ORCID iD reliably connects you with your research contributions and affiliations, ensuring accuracy even if you undergo job changes, change your name, or shift your field of research.

Introduction to ORCID. We will discuss what the purpose is behind ORCID, what is a persistent identifier, and why researchers should have an ORCID iD. How to Complete Your Grad Student Tax Return (and Understand It, Too!) (Tax Year 2023) The purpose of this virtual, asynchronous workshop is to teach graduate students about the federal higher education tax benefits available to them, including how to tabulate, calculate, and report their funding and education expenses. This workshop is specifically for students who are employed as graduate assistants. The tax workshop is asynchronous and includes videos and worksheets. The workshop cost is usually \$25 but the University of Houston Graduate School is providing access to the workshops free to the first 100 graduate students to register (preference will be given to graduate students who are employed as teaching or research assistants).
