

Campus Environment: Seniors

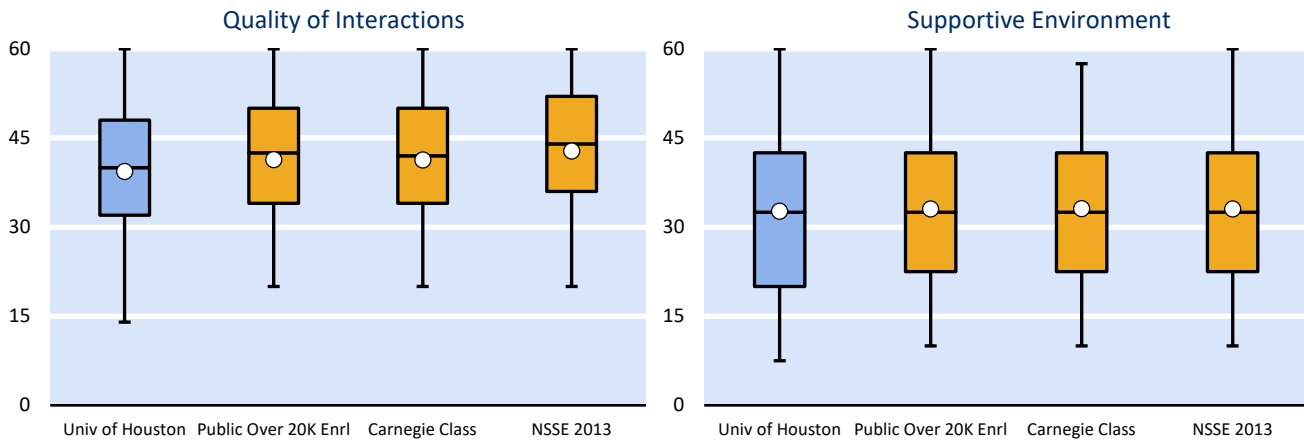
