Even online testing - taking exams used to be excruciating because sitting there doing the tedium of an exam killed me and my performance was lackluster even if I knew the material. Now I can get up, go get a drink while the test timer is running, use a fidget toy, and get my mind focused again. Plus I have GAD which made being around people very hard to concentrate. I would get home too exhausted to study. At home, with a textbook and direction, even statistics was great! My grades before were average at best (I dropped out due to mental illness a few years ago). Now that I'm online, I've made a 4.0 doing classes AND working full-time for four semesters. I'm grateful that UH made an environment where I could succeed and actually learn things. So, don't change that. Do more of it! I'm graduating this semester, but for other people like me!

One thing I truly think the University of Houston needs to improve on is the idea spouted from not only outside voices, but students as well, that UH is a commuter campus with no real student culture. I think that is one of the biggest issues with our campus, and it hurts the image the university is trying to build for ourselves nationally.

There needs to be an effective way to bring more students to campus and have them feel as though campus is the "spot" to be at. While it is a great advantage to have so many options around the Houston area to socialize in, the university needs to work to bring that same appeal to campus so that students are more enticed to stay on campus to socialize, building a community that is attractive to those looking for the complete college experience.

Issues that I frequently talk about with other students regarding the above is the limited amount of affordable, safe housing on and around campus. Not all of us want or can manage living in a dorm (students with children, etc.) and the few apartments available are either too expensive compared to other housing off campus or too old and broken down to be worth living at. It's also difficult putting yourself in a situation where you would live close to areas that are more prone to crime than living farther away off campus in safer places.

Another issue is that there aren't enough social hangout spots that are open late and popular on weekends. This campus is dead during the weekends. By bringing in better entertainment (more showings of popular movies, more bars/lounges, more independent coffee cafes) then more people would be interested in staying on campus instead of going straight home after class.

Lastly, there is a bad ideology in many student's minds that UH is the place to go when you want to be closer to home, or to save money. Many student work or have families while attending school full time and somehow that has turned into a reason for less social activity on campus. We have to get past that reasoning and encourage more interaction with campus to help build the attitude that UH is the place to be.
