#### **Course Overview**



In Longitudinal Primary Care, students practice clinical skills under the guidance of a faculty preceptor in an ambulatory care setting. Students apply the knowledge and skills learned in their other courses to the care of patients, working closely with their preceptor.

The clinical skills and problem-solving skills learned in this course are foundational to the practice of medicine in every clinical setting.



#### LPC 1A (Fall Semester)

July 22, 2025 - Dec 8, 2025

Focus on practicing history taking, performing physical exams, recording and reporting findings, and demonstrating clinical teamwork and professionalism.

#### **LPC 1B (Spring Semester)**

Jan 2, 2025 – Jun 6, 2025

Continuation of LPC1A, with a focus on practicing advanced exam maneuvers, focused oral presentations, and more refined documentation. Propose age and gender specific health screening interventions.



#### LPC 2A (Fall Semester)

July 22, 2025 - Dec 8, 2025

Focused history taking, hypothesis-driven physical exams, formulating assessments, developing differential diagnoses, proposing diagnostic evaluations, giving oral presentations and writing SOAP notes.

#### **LPC 2B (January 2026)**

Continuation of LPC2A, same as LPC2A with the addition of the mental status exam.

#### **Expectations of students:**

If they **miss** a session for any reason, OK to make up the activity **during the semester. They** must **notify** you

ONLY allowed LPC excused absences are; HCC visits, HCC Seminars, and CFS week (s). They WILL NOT need to make these hours



#### Our expectations of students

- Attend all scheduled sessions at their assigned clinical site
- Spend about 4 hours in clinic
- Complete a clinical assignment (details to follow)
- Demonstrate professional behavior
  - Respect for patients, families and the clinical team
  - Honesty and trustworthiness
  - Communicate absences or tardiness as expected of a pre-professional student



#### Our expectations of students

- Arrive at your office at least 10 minutes early\*
- Review their weekly assignment with you
- Ask you to identify patients for them to see

\* Note: students may have required morning classes in the mornin and may not be able to arrive early, depending on traffic, etc

- Complete an absence request with the College of Med
- Notify you or your staff in a timely manner



#### LPC1 A COURSE OBJECTIVES



- 1. Obtain histories from patients and families with preceptor guidance
- 2. Demonstrate basic physical exam skills with preceptor guidance
- 3. Document history and normal physical exam findings, using a rubric.
- 4. Perform limited oral presentations (chief concern and history of present illness), with guidance
- 5. Demonstrate respect for patients, families, caregivers and team members
- 6. Demonstrate respect for patient privacy and confidentiality.
- 7. Demonstrate behavior appropriate for a member of the healthcare team
- 8. Complete clinical, administrative and educational tasks in a timely manner.

## **Continuity Clinic**



- 4-hour sessions with your preceptor
- Once a week, most weeks
- Student Activity [clinical assignment] to complete weekly
- Assigned tasks follow what you have already learned in PPP and practiced in CCASEL

## **Continuity Clinic: Logistics**

- Plan to arrive at least 10 min early
- Notify your preceptor if you will be late
- Review your weekly clinical assignment with your preceptor

NOTE: You *MAY NOT* handle sharps, regardless of any training you had prior to entering UHCOM

# **NEEDLESTICK INJURY Reminder: No handling sharps!**

- 9. In the event of a needlestick or other exposure to potentially infective materials, please follow the protocol that was discussed during orientation: Clean the area with soap and water and seek medical attention as soon as possible per the UH Environmental Health and Life Safety Protocol.
  - Students are required to report any potential exposure to a blood borne pathogen. Within 24 hours of the incident, not later than the next business day, contact UH Environmental Health & Life Safety at (713) 743-5858 to report incident, and complete the UH Student/Visitor Accident Report Form. Submit one (1) copy to UH Environmental Health & Life Safety, one (1) copy to faculty, and one (1) copy for your permanent student records.

## Course Requirements

- 1. Preceptor evaluation of clinical skills and professional behavior (rubric uploaded to course home page in Canvas)
- 2. Completion of required 36 clinical hours with your preceptor
- 3. Professionalism, which includes:
  - Timely submission of weekly assignment in Canvas
  - Strict adherence to attendance policy
  - Timely communication with course directors and preceptor.
     Preceptor assessment of professional behavior

## Criteria for pass:

- 1. Preceptor evaluation:
  - Score equivalent of 'meets expectations' on 80% of assessment items 2 - 5
- 2. Continuity Clinic (CC): Must complete 36 clinical hours prior to the end of the course to pass
- 3. Professionalism:
  - No professionalism concerns (adherence to attendance policy.
  - Preceptor evaluation of "satisfactory" on items 6-9).
  - Timely completion of academic and administrative responsibilities

## How did we come up with 36 hours?



All Continuity Clinic sessions are considered active learning and mandatory

- 10 sessions X 4 hours each
- MINUS 10% allowed absence (per Attendance policy)

**= 40 hours** 

= 36 hours

### Mid semester feedback



- Mid-semester feedback will be provided to all students
  - Preceptor evaluation: observed clinical and professional strengths/weaknesses
  - Course Director(s) feedback: on track or not to meet course goals
- Required for ALL pre-clerkship courses
- Midcourse feedback is an LCME requirement

## **Element 9.7 Formative Assessment and Feedback**

The medical school's curricular governance committee ensures that each medical student is assessed and provided with formal formative feedback early enough during each required course or clerkship to allow sufficient time for remediation. Formal feedback occurs at least at the midpoint of the course or clerkship. A course or clerkship less than four weeks in length provides alternate means by which medical students can measure their progress in learning.

# Mid-semester Feedback - Criteria for Below Expectations

- Score equivalent of 'meets expectations' on fewer than 80% of assessment items 2-7
- Failure to complete at least 18 of the required 36 clinical hours by 10/6
- Professionalism or attendance concerns

## For any student below expectations

- Written mid-course feedback, AND
- Required meeting with Course Director(s)

## Why?

- UHCOM requirement
- It's the right thing to do
  - Review areas of weakness
  - Develop improvement plan
  - Helps ensure mastery of course content & successful course completion





# Student Mistreatment

Mistreatment Reporting Summary – The Tilman J. Fertitta Family College of Medicine is committed to maintaining an environment where there is mutual respect between students and teachers, and between peers. Behavior that is abusive or mistreats students or others in the learning environment is prohibited.





## **Embarassment VS Humiliation**

### **Embarrassment:**

- Common feeling
- Comes from ourself
- Provoked by making a mistake, or not living up to our own expectations
- Can be motivating

#### **Humiliation:**

- Comes from someone else
- Being made to feel unworthy or 'less than'
- Provokes shame
- Not motivating
- Not conducive to learning

## **Embarrassment VS Humiliation**

### **Scenario:**

Student arrives 30 minutes late for clinic and has forgotten to notify the preceptor or team.

Student feels embarrassed.

Preceptor reprimands student in front of the whole clinic team "You are the worst, most irresponsible student I've ever worked with, etc."

Student feels humiliated.

It's OK to feel embarassed, it's not OK to be humiliated.

# Preceptor Absences - Canvas



- If your preceptor is unavailable, notify the LPC
   Team immediately.
- Reach out as soon as you're aware of the absence—timely communication is critical.
- There is no need to upload your passport if a CC session is missed due to a preceptor absence.
- Instead, leave a clear comment in the comments section in Canvas explaining why the session was missed.



### Needlestick/Bloodborne Pathogen Exposure



### NEEDLESTICK/BLOODBORNE PATHOGEN EXPOSURE

- For mucous membrane exposure (eye or oral) flush the injured site with water or saline for at least 15 minutes. For exposure to other areas, wash thoroughly for 15 minutes with soap and water. Cover the wound with a dry dressing, if necessary
- 2. If the source patient is known and present, keep the individual on-site for a blood draw.
- Notify your clinical supervisor (depending on where the event occurred this could be a preceptor, resident, or attending) to report the injury.
- 4. Notify a clinic manager or hospital supervisor *immediately*
- Next, seek IMMEDIATE MEDICAL EVALUATION
   AND TREATMENT from any clinic, urgent care
   center, or hospital emergency room. An ER may
   be the best source of care. For those covered by
   academic health insurance, any Methodist,

- Memorial Hermann, or HCA ER should be covered.

- 7. AS SOON AS POSSIBLE or within 1 business day of the event (at the latest)
  - -Notify both the course director [LIC, LPC, or ACE] AND Student Affairs

From the landing page click the Report an EHS Incident which will open the reporting form. Not everything will apply to you but be as thorough as you can. - Provides regular real-time oral and written feedback for their assigned student (e.g. by completing requested session and course assessments of their student); AND,
- Maintains all requirements for a faculty appointment at the TJFFCOM, including completing all faculty appointment credentialing and onboarding requirements.
- At any time, if a preceptor drops out or does not have a student assigned to them, they are no longer eligible for CPD reimbursement.
