Curious Minds C-E-R Board Instructions

Welcome campers/assistant detectives! After reviewing all the interrogations, it is time for you to decide who is responsible for introducing the invasive species that wiped out the *teach*HOUSTON turtle population. Below, you will create your **argument**, which consists of three parts: a **claim**, **evidence**, and **reasoning**.

As part of your detective training, we provided key questions to help you present a great argument:

- 1. Develop a claim.
 - a. Who is the responsible culprit: Ms. Kelp or Ms. Coral? What is your answer to this question?
- 2. Gather the evidence needed for your claim.
 - a. What information presented in the video leads you to believe that this is the guilty suspect?
- 3. Describe how your evidence led you to your claim.
 - a. Does the evidence support your argument? How does this evidence indicate that the suspect you chose introduced the invasive species harming the tH turtles?
