Capstone Testing Results

The Pharmacy Curriculum Outcomes Assessment (PCOA) which is a standardized exam for pharmacy curriculums produced and administered by the National Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) is utilized in the P1 and P2 years as a formative assessment. In the P3 year, the PCOA is a high stakes exam and the students accomplish minimum competency in order to progress to their Advanced Pharmacy Practice Experiences (APPEs).
