IMPACT & ENGAGEMENT

Interprofessional education (IPE) is a major component of the UHCOP curriculum. Our students learn about, from, and with health care professionals from diverse backgrounds and specialties, preparing them to work in interprofessional teams upon graduation. These clinics and programs provide opportunities to collaborate and improve health outcomes for patients across the greater Houston region and beyond.

The multidisciplinary, student-run H.O.M.E.S. (Houston Outreach Medicine, Education, and Social Services) Clinic provides Houstonians experiencing unstable housing with medical care on Sundays, when options are typically limited to the emergency room.



Vecino Denver Harbor Family Health Clinic makes medical, dental, and behavioral health services accessible to the medically underserved, while working toward a day when the term "medically underserved" does not apply anywhere in Houston.



In collaboration with Doctors Hospital at Renaissance in Edinburg, the Rio Grande Valley (RGV) Pharm.D. Satellite Program provides students with an opportunity to work in an integrated health care environment and dedicate themselves to a region rich in culture, history and natural beauty, but burdened by chronic disease, health disparities, and limited health care access.

The first-of-its-kind in the nation, 18-hour Pharmacy Certificate in Hispanic Healthcare program provides Pharm.D. students with advanced skills and knowledge to deliver culturally and linguistically competent pharmacy care services to Hispanic and Spanish-speaking patient populations, including specific health and medical experiential learning and practice through fieldwork and/or public service and outreach.



DR. GOMIKA UDUGAMASOORIYA

Professor, Pharmacological and Pharmaceutical Sciences

Named a Senior Member of the National Academy of Inventors in 2023, Dr. Udugamasooriya has partnered with Grammy-nominated recording artist Aloe Blacc to develop a method of identifying compounds that can block viral infections—the molecular equivalent of a face mask. He also is applying the unique drug discovery techniques he developed to identify novel compounds for cancer and other diseases.

DR. VINCENT TAM

Professor, Pharmacy Practice and Translational Research/Pharmacological and Pharmaceutical Sciences

Dr. Tam has secured multiple patents and National Institutes of Health grants for his research, which includes the development of a rapid diagnostic device to guide clinicians with more precise drug combinations against resistant bacteria, as well as optimizing a potent, but toxic, antibiotic of "last resort" for multidrug resistant infections.

Clinical Associate Professor, Pharmacy Practice and Translational Research

A board-certified geriatrics pharmacist and alumna of the college, Dr. Fernandez works in the Southeast Texas Geriatric Workforce Enhancement Program to educate and train students, fellow professionals, and elder care advocates on age-friendly health care. As part of the multi-institutional, multidisciplinary collaboration funded by the U.S. Health Resources Services Administration, Dr. Fernandez and her pharmacy colleagues provide evidence-based pharmacotherapy guidance for the older adult patient.
