- What are some unique opportunities your program offers students?
- How quickly do students get into the clinical settings?
- What research opportunities do you offer?
- What sets your program apart from other schools?
- What is your first year class size?
- What is the average day like for a first-year student?
- What opportunities/offerings are there in regards to diversity and POC at your school?
- How does your school prepare students for selecting a specialty and applying for residency or employment?
- What are the opportunities available for research?
- Can you describe some community service opportunities available through your program?
- What programs are set in place to allow students to learn what it is like to run their own practice?
- What resources does your school offer for students who are struggling in academics?
- How do you avoid burnout in a profession that requires so much of your time and commitment?
- Can you share information about your program's curriculum type?
- If I submit my application later in the cycle, would that lessen my chances of obtaining admission?
- Are students who don't apply right out of college, but take a gap year looked down upon or looked at last?
- During a gap year, what do you like to see added onto an application?
- Do you give less preference to students that graduate early and didn't attend college for four full years?
- Does being a non-science major affect my chances of getting into your program?
- What is the most important part of the application that is looked at for reapplicants?
- Is research necessary?
- If I were to apply after I obtain a Master's degree, would you base my admittance into your program more so on my performance while obtaining the Master's degree rather than my performance obtaining my Bachelor's degree? Or would they both be equally evaluated?
