## FY2025 One-Time Request #1 – Fiesta Concert

The Student Program Board is submitting one FY2025 One-Time Request to the Student Fees Advisory Committee for our Fiesta concert.

Thanks to our original FY24 request, SPB successfully brought notable artists Juicy J and Social House to Fiesta, greatly appealing to UH students and boosting engagement and participation. However, as we aim to feature even higher-caliber artists at Fiesta, it's crucial that we secure the necessary resources to meet their performance standards. These top-tier performers often demand advanced staging, production, and AV setups, which entail additional costs.

Drawing from insights gained during past large-scale events in Houston where safety concerns were a significant factor, SPB is making safety our top priority while simultaneously enhancing our artist lineup. To achieve this, we are requesting the use of the Fertitta Center, especially since Fiesta is open to the public. SPB and Fiesta have collectively opted for this alternative location also due to its exceptional suitability for concert viewing and the enhanced safety measures it affords. This choice assures that students can fully enjoy the concert experience while remaining in a secure and controlled environment. Opting for an enclosed venue not only boosts accessibility but also provides better control over the event environment, a level of control that proves challenging in open settings. This preference aligns with the requirement set by the University of Houston Police Chief. Additionally, it offers significant cost-saving advantages compared to hosting the event at a larger and more expensive venue like the TDECU Stadium.

The Fiesta concert has consistently served as a cornerstone of Fiesta programming, and SPB is committed to keeping this wonderful tradition alive and engaging for students.
