V. "Exempting Certain Confirmation Process"; SGAB-55006 (Second Read)

- Will remove Individual Confirmation Hearings for most University-wide Committees
- AFB, SFAC, University Hearing Board, Student Traffic Court and Appellate Board will still require Individual Confirmation Hearings due to the importance of those roles
- Vice-President will provide a bi-weekly report to be approved by the Senate
- This report will include resumes and answers to a questionnaire relevant to the Committee to which an individual is being appointed
- Approval of this report will serve as approval of appointees within the report
- Senate will have the power to request Individual Confirmation Hearings for any appointment through a simple majority vote
- This Individual Confirmation Hearing will take place at the next feasible Senate meeting, at which time the Senate may vote on the appointment

VII. "Supporting Higher Wages for Lower-Income Campus Staff"; SGAR-55006 (Vote)

- Shows support for a University of Houston Human-Resources Department full PayScale Review
- Supports University Minimum Wage to be increased to \$9 per hour, followed by an increase above \$10 per hour after Fall 2022
- This change should be implemented in all new employees
- This change should be implemented in current employees through twenty-five cents increase per quarter
- Paygrade 101 should be abolished
- Pay-scale curve should be flattened
