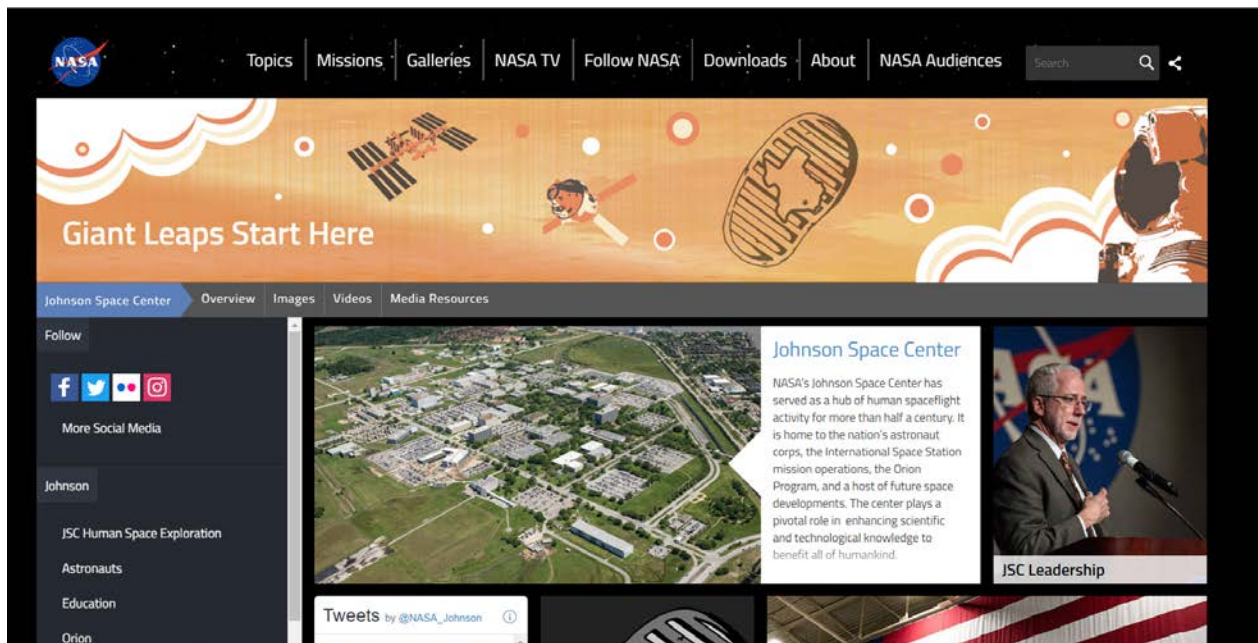

A.D. Bruce Religion Center

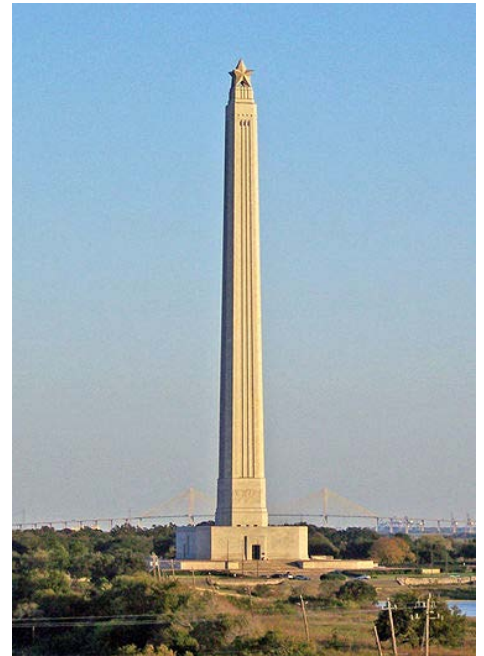
- Focal point for many on-campus religious activities

The M/V Sam Houston has been operating as Port Houston's public tour vessel since its inaugural voyage on July 30, 1958. This free service offers a leisurely, 90-minute round-trip, educational tour along the Houston Ship Channel. Individuals and groups are invited aboard to learn more about the port and maritime industry.

Embarking from Port Houston's Sam Houston Landing, visiting sightseers aboard the M/V Sam Houston can enjoy passing views of international cargo vessels and operations at the port's Turning Basin Terminal. The 95-ft. vessel holds up to 100 passengers and features air-conditioned, lounge seating, as well as standing room outside on the boat's deck.

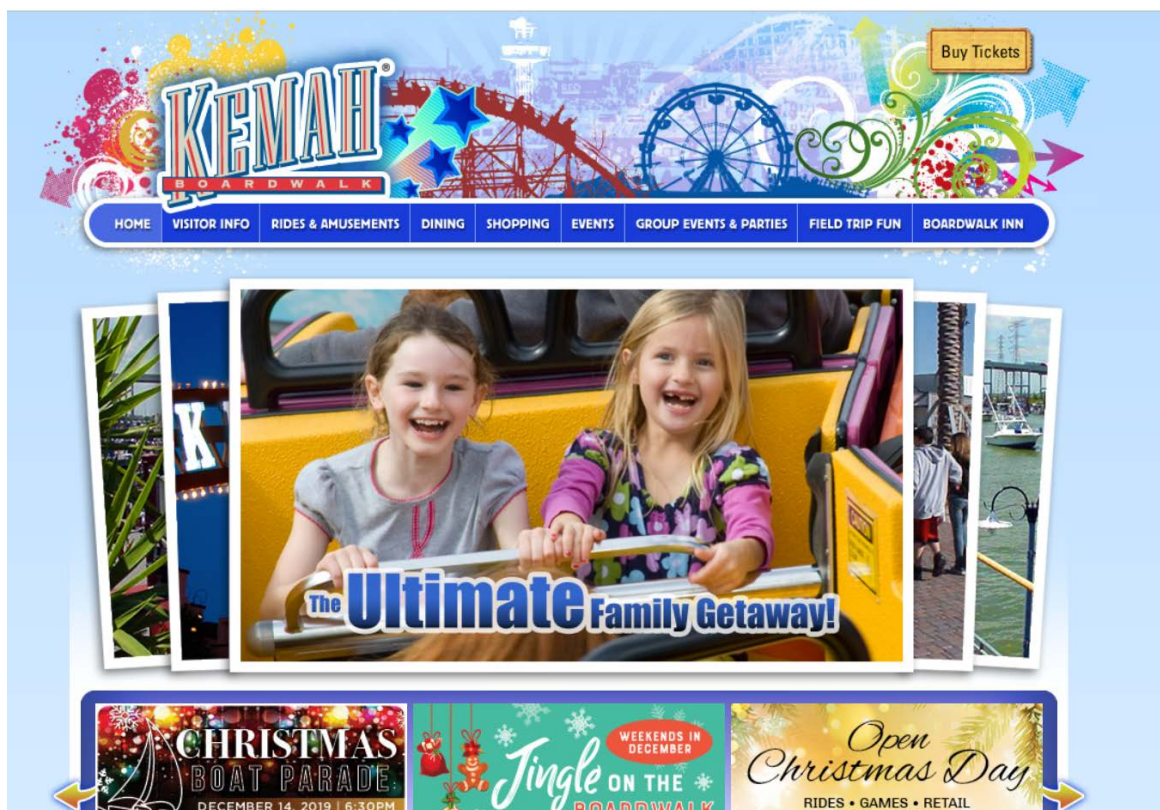

Brazos Bend State Park

Hiking, Biking and Wildlife Viewing

There are almost 25 miles of hiking and biking trails, including an 8-mile equestrian trail system. Consult your park map. Please ride at a safe speed and be considerate of other trail users. The park does not rent bicycles. No off-road vehicles are permitted. Trails marked "foot trail" or "foot traffic only" are not suitable for bicycle traffic.

Elm Lake and 40-Acre Lake trail systems are the best areas to view alligators. Alligators are best viewed in the spring and fall or on mild winter days. They do not like it too hot, too cold or too cloudy and rainy. In the summer months, they are best viewed in the early morning and late evening. Know your Alligator Etiquette found on the park map. Always take plenty of water and your map. Insect repellent is also a good idea. **Pets on leash only.** Leash can be no longer than six feet. **Do not, under any circumstances, allow pets to drink from the lake or enter the water! Bring water for your pet.**

The Horseshoe Lake area trails are more forested with less wetland habitat. The Brazos River is best viewed from the Red Buckeye Trail. Birdwatching is excellent throughout the park. Bring your binoculars. 40-Acre, Pilant and Elm lakes are the best areas to view wading birds and waterfowl, with a mix of songbirds and sparrows. Raptors can be viewed anywhere. Hale Lake area is more suitable for forest and songbirds. The Prairie Trails are good for sparrows and other upland birds. The Prairie Trails start at the 40-Acre Lake parking area. Wildflowers can be found throughout the park and are very diverse according to

habitat but the best variety can be found on the prairies. Field guides for plants and animals can be purchased at the headquarters and Nature Center gift shops. The Creekfield Lake All-Accessible Trail is a paved half-mile trail. Take the crosswalk from the Nature Center and Observatory parking lot. Wayside exhibits are usable for everyone. Marsh and woodland habitat are viewed from this trail.

Nature Center

Located near the center of the park, this facility houses exhibits pertaining to the three major ecosystems in the park and there are also live snakes, baby alligators and turtles on display. The center should be the first stop for first-time visitors. The center is free and open to the public on weekends and most holidays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., and weekdays from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. At least three free programs/hikes are offered every Saturday and Sunday.

Educational Activities

An Outdoor Guidebook is available in the Nature Center Gift Shop. The Gatorwise Club for kids can be completed in a few hours by taking a guided hike or attending a program and answering a few questions about the ecosystems. The Junior Naturalist Club is a more involved program involving three patches that can be earned. Depending on the patch, it may take a day or more to complete but can be completed at any time. Scavenger hunts and alligator census pages are also available. Visit www.brazosbend.org for a variety of information about the park including all of the above, plus animal and plant checklists and the weekend program schedule. You can also find information about our volunteer organization and how to become a member. On weekdays, the Interpretive staff offers programs and hikes for school groups and other organizations, both on and off site. Call (979) 553-5123 or (979) 553-5124 for information and fees.

The George Observatory

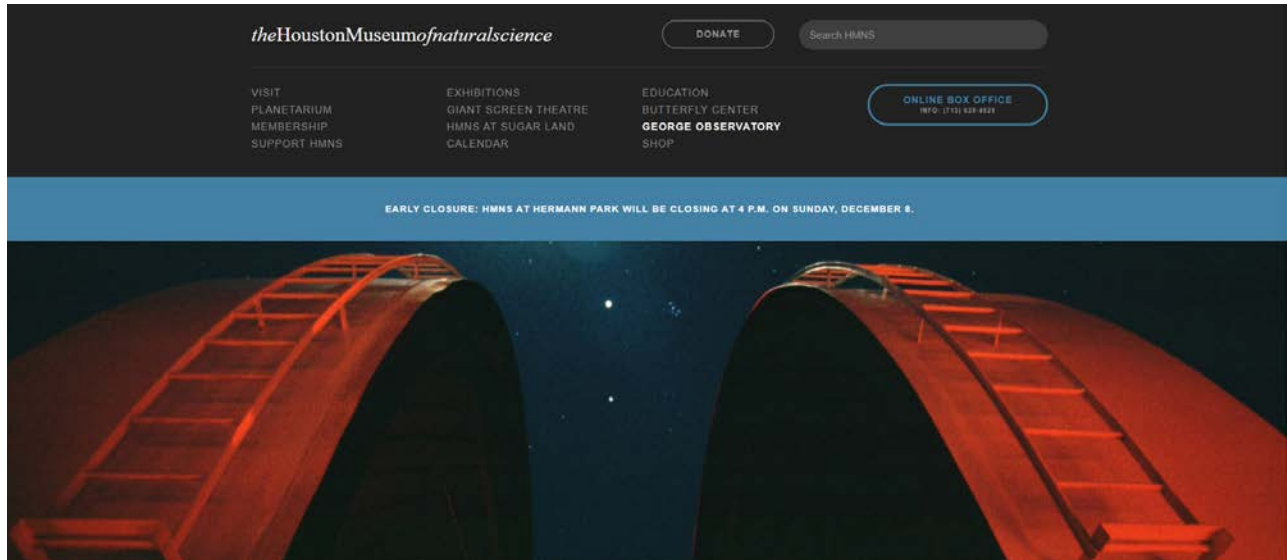

The Galveston-Port Bolivar ferry

The Galveston-Port Bolivar ferry takes travelers on SH 87 between Galveston Island and the Bolivar Peninsula. One vessel is in operation 24 hours per day. A second vessel will be placed in service at 6:30 a.m. After this departure, the two vessels will operate based on traffic volumes, and will space themselves to carry traffic as efficiently and safely as possible. A third vessel will be placed in service during the afternoon period if necessary. Up to five vessels may be operated for summer and holiday traffic.

More than 8 million passengers ride the Port Aransas and Galveston-Port Bolivar ferries annually. The two routes operate 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, weather permitting.

Port Aransas

The Port Aransas route runs between two and six ferries a day and connects travelers on SH 361 a link across the Corpus Christi Channel between Aransas Pass, on the mainland, and Port Aransas, on Mustang Island. The quarter-mile route typically takes less than ten minutes, although peak summer hours may require drivers to wait longer.

Each ferry can carry up to 20 regular passenger vehicles. Combined vehicles, such as a truck towing a boat, may not be longer than 80 feet, wider than 13 feet or taller than 13 feet 6 inches. Single-axle vehicles may weigh no more than 20,000 pounds, tandem axles no more than 34,000 pounds and combination vehicles may not exceed a total of 80,000 pounds.

ONE SERVICE, TWO FERRY BOATS

Lynch's Ferry, a flat-bottomed boat powered by nothing more than a hand-pulled rope, aided a San Jacinto River crossing for 1820s traffic traveling along the primary land route between South Texas and the Mexican border. Constructed and operated by local settler Nathaniel Lynch, who also established nearby Lynchburg (another Lynch operation that included a steam-driven sawmill). Lynch arrived in the Mexican territory as a colonist of Stephen F. Austin's Old Three Hundred. Although Lynch's Ferry wasn't the only waterway conveyance in the area at the time (Lorenzo De Zavalla operated a nearby Buffalo Bayou crossing), it garnered special attention during the Runaway Scrape as colonists who were revolting against Mexican rule used it in their escape route as they fled the

oncoming Mexican Army. Lynch, a businessman, was accused of overcharging for the ferry service but after his death fees were set by the Harris County Commissioners Court until the service came under Harris County stewardship in 1888. Since then, the ferry service has been free. Today, two ferry boats provide Lynchburg Ferry service, carrying vehicles and pedestrians across a landscape dramatically transformed by the international shipping and petrochemical industries. The north ferry landing is located at the end of the Crosby-Lynchburg Road just south of Lynchburg. A short seven to ten minute ride on either ferryboats, the William P. Hobby or the Ross S. Sterling, will deposit you and your vehicle to the southern ferry landing and San Jacinto State Park.
