VOLUNTEERS MUST READ!

1. **Sign In!** Go to the Sign-In section of this binder and verify your time and location by initialing by your name. If you are not on the master list, write your name neatly next to your time and location and then initial.
2. **Never leave the radio alone!** At the end of the day, we will pick up the radio.
3. **First shift sets out the materials!**
4. **Water will be delivered according to the water delivery schedule!** Water will be delivered at the beginning of every shift (around 8 a.m., and then at 9 a.m., 11 a.m., 1 p.m., and 3 p.m.), and as needed. Water for volunteers only will be delivered at 7 a.m. Make sure to leave water for volunteers.
5. **If you run out of a particular handout or give-away, call Home Base!** We have more of many items and we will bring you anything that is available.
6. **Do not pour out the melted ice water from the buckets!** Even after the ice has melted, the cold water will help keep the bottled water cool.
7. **Record tally at the end of the shift! NEVER CLEAR THE TALLY COUNTER.** Periodically, write down your tally and the time of that tally on the tally page. If your tally counter stops working, use the Tally Count page (next page) to keep track and radio base to bring you a tally counter on the next scheduled delivery.
8. **Do not turn away a student with a difficult question!** Check the FAQ section or call Home Base.
9. **Last shift puts materials back in the box!** Do not take down and include the banner in the box (we have had some stolen). Do not put the radio or water in the box. Wait for someone to pick up the radio and box.
10. **Record suggestions!** Jot down any ideas or suggestions in the Suggestion Section of the binder.
11. **Call Home Base with schedule questions!** To save paper, we are not putting out copies of the very long class schedule at each table. However, Home Base does have access to the online schedule.
12. **Be proactive!** Don't wait for students to approach you. Ask them if they need help or want water. Welcome them to UH.
13. **Keep Hydrated!** It is hot out there.

At the University of Houston, you'll find degree programs that will pave the way to the future you envision—whether you want to build the physical foundations of the future as an engineer or architect, shape young minds as an educator, or study how far humanity has already come as an anthropologist. You are a **freshman** if you:

- are a student without college credit or
- earned college credit prior to high school graduation (dual credit/early college high school)* or
- earned less than 15 transferable hours of college credit after earning a GED or high school diploma* and
- are a U.S. citizen, have applied for permanent residency, or qualify for Texas residency based on Senate Bill 1528 (<http://www.theccb.state.tx.us/reports/PDF/1528.PDF>)

*Only credit earned from an institution accredited by one of the six regional accrediting associations will be accepted.

You are an **international freshman** (<http://www.uh.edu/undergraduate-admissions/apply/international/international-freshman/>) if you:

- are not a citizen or permanent resident of the United States and
- are not graduating from a Texas high school after three years in residence in Texas (please review Senate Bill 1528 (<http://www.theccb.state.tx.us/reports/PDF/1528.PDF>))

No Class Rank

No class rank? No problem. Students with no class rank can still be considered for admission by individual review. In lieu of an official rank provided on a transcript, a statement of rank provided by a school administrator is sufficient. The statement of rank should include a student's name, UH ID and a confirmation as to whether the student would fall in the top 10 percent, top 20 percent, etc., of their respective graduating class.

Rank statements should be submitted to admissions@uh.edu (<mailto:admissions@uh.edu>).

Official Transcripts

Here's how to send your transcript to UH:

1. **(Preferred method for faster service)** Ask your school administrator to send your transcript data electronically through an EDI (Electronic Data Interchange) system, e.g. TReX (for Texas institutions).
2. Can't send it electronically? That's okay! Ask your school administrator to send us a PDF version of your official transcript through Parchment/Naviance.
3. If both of these options aren't available, ask your school to mail your official transcript to the address below.

Dual Credit & Early College High School

All students who are currently enrolled in high school at the time of their admissions application to UH must apply as a freshman (regardless of the number of college credit hours they have earned in high school). Applying as a freshman allows all dual credit and early college high school students to take advantage of the financial, academic, and housing opportunities that are specifically set aside for freshman students transitioning from high school to college.

Earning an Associate's Degree in high school does not guarantee admission to UH and does not classify an applicant as a transfer student. However, earning an Associate's Degree will be taken into consideration during admission review.

What do I need to do in order to apply for admission to the university?

When is the deadline to apply?

Where can I get a copy of my acceptance letter?

The Office of Admissions (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/admissions/>) will be able to provide you with a copy of your acceptance letter.

How long does it take for the Office of Admissions to evaluate my transcript?

It usually takes the Office of Admissions (#) 2 to 3 weeks to evaluate your transcript. Admissions will do everything they can to make sure it is evaluated as soon as possible. Where do I turn in my transcripts from my high school or previous college or university?

The Office of Admissions (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/admissions/>) will accept transcripts from other institutions.

What is a Texas Success Initiative (TSI) hold?

Academic Advising in Exploratory Studies places this service indicator (hold) on your record when you have not satisfied all portions of the THEA exam. Please contact the Academic Advisors in Cougar Village II North, in room N140 (<http://www.uh.edu/ussc/exploratorystudies/>), to have the service indicator (hold) removed.

What courses are transferable from another university/community college to UH?

Please go to the Welcome Center (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/>) and visit with a Transfer Counselor in the Office of Admissions (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/admissions/>) or visit the Transfer Credit section (<http://www.uh.edu/admissions/admitted/transfer-credit/>) of the UH website.

Adds/Drops and Enrollment

Important dates.

Check the Academic Calendar (<http://www.uh.edu/academic-calendar-undergraduate>) for important dates, such as when to register for classes, when to drop classes, exam periods, holidays and more.

What is the difference between dropping and withdrawing?

To drop a course means you are going to maintain some enrollment for the academic semester. Dropping all courses at the University of Houston constitutes a "withdrawal from the university."

What is the Term Withdrawal procedure at UH?

Please note: Term withdrawal means the student is dropping all courses in all sessions of the term and withdrawing from the university for the current term.

The procedure options vary depending on your student affiliation (Graduate, Undergraduate, (and or not) International). This topic is covered in detail on the Academic Forms ([../forms/index.php#termwithdraw](http://www.uh.edu/forms/index.php#termwithdraw)) web page.

When can I withdraw from all my courses and get a full refund?

You must complete the Term Withdrawal ([../forms/index.php#termwithdraw](http://www.uh.edu/forms/index.php#termwithdraw)) process *prior* to the first day of class to receive a 100 percent refund. Refund information is available on the Costs & Financial Aid (<http://www.uh.edu/financial/payment/>) site and the Student Business Services (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/student-business-services/>) (Bursar) site.

I have a Negative Service Indicator (stop) preventing me from enrolling. What do I do so that I can get it removed and enroll?

Please contact the office (<http://www.uh.edu/academics/courses-enrollment/enrollment-faq/enrollment-stops/>) that has put the indicator on your account.

Can I still drop my class with a Q?

No, Q drops are no longer available. Summer 2007 was the last semester. For more information about dropping courses, see the Undergraduate Catalog (<http://www.uh.edu/catalog-undergraduate>) or Graduate Catalog (<http://www.uh.edu/graduate-catalog>).

When can I drop a course(s) and get a full refund?

You must drop a course (while maintaining enrollment) prior to the appointed Official Reporting Day (ORD) (<http://publications.uh.edu/content.php?catoid=25&navoid=9166>) date to receive 100 percent refund on that course. Refund information is available on the Costs & Financial Aid (<http://www.uh.edu/financial/payment/>) site and the Student Business Services (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/student-business-services/>) (Bursar) site.

How do I add courses?

Until the end of the registration period, students can add courses in myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu>). Students who registered and paid by the payment due date ([/financial/payment/billing-due-dates/](http://www.uh.edu/financial/payment/billing-due-dates/)) will not be charged late fees for adding classes; any additional tuition and fees will be added to their student account.

How do I drop a course?

Until the Official Reporting Day (ORD) (<http://publications.uh.edu/content.php?catoid=25&navoid=9166>), courses can be dropped online at myUH (<https://myuh.uh.edu/>). Students who drop by the ORD will receive 100 percent refund for dropping course(s) while maintaining enrollment. See the Costs & Financial Aid (<http://www.uh.edu/financial/payment/>) site and the Student Business Services (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/student-business-services/>) (Bursar) site for more refund information.

After the Official Reporting Day (ORD) (<http://publications.uh.edu/content.php?catoid=25&navoid=9166>), students must drop a course by following these steps:

Undergraduate Students

Log in to your myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>) account to drop your course online by the date listed in the UH Academic Calendar (<http://www.uh.edu/academic-calendar-undergraduate>). Paper forms are no longer used to drop a class. Undergraduates who have reached their 6 Ws (<http://www.uh.edu/provost/policies/student/#2>) grade limit must complete all courses.

*Students should review the Undergraduate Enrollment Cap, Repeated Course Cap (Three-peat rule), Dropping Courses Policy (6 Ws) and Undergraduate Tuition Rebate (<http://www.uh.edu/provost/policies/student/#2>) information to avoid additional costs and penalties. Also, see information about attempted hours. Undergraduates who have exceeded their 6 Ws grades limit must complete all courses.

Graduate Students

1. Pick up a Student Initiated Drop form from any academic department. You will need one form per course.
2. Complete the form in its entirety and sign it. Obtain course instructor's signature.
3. Submit the completed form to the Office of the University Registrar service desk in the Welcome Center (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/>) by close of business on the Drop Due Date.
 - * Students should continue to attend the class until the drop is visible in myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>).

Can international students drop below full-time status?

F1 Visa and J1 Visa students are required to maintain full-time enrollment. Students on these visas must meet with an ISSSO counselor to be approved for a reduction in course load.

Requests must be made in a timely manner and will not be considered after the last day to drop for the term has passed.

Can athletes drop below full-time status?

Student-athletes are required to maintain full-time enrollment. On the first day of a new term, UH athletes must meet with an athletic counselor to be approved for a reduction in course load. Requests must be made in a timely manner and will not be considered after the last day to drop for the term has passed.

How do I late register?

Go to myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>). You may late register until the last day of enrollment (<http://www.uh.edu/academic-calendar-undergraduate>) at 5 p.m. A \$20 late registration fee will be assessed.

Classes/Courses

What is a Winter Mini Session class?

Winter Mini Session classes are classes that are being taught during the Winter Holiday Break. The dates for the classes can be found in the Academic Calendar (<http://www.uh.edu/academic-calendar-undergraduate>).

How do I find and enroll in Winter Mini Session classes?

The complete list of all Winter Mini Session classes can be found in the *CLASS SEARCH* option of your myUH (<https://myuh.uh.edu/>) self-service account. Under *CLASS SEARCH CRITERIA*, select your Course Career from the drop-down menu and use the *ADDITIONAL SEARCH CRITERIA* section to choose Mini Session from the drop-down menu.

How does the course numbering system work?

The first two digits of a course number are significant. The first indicates the scholastic level: 1000 series, freshman, 2000 series, sophomore; 3000 series, junior; 4000 and 5000 series, senior; 6000, 7000 and 8000 series, graduate. The second digit indicates the number of semester hours of credit given for the course. The number given corresponds exactly with the semester hours of credit given. For additional information regarding course numbers, contact a department or faculty adviser.

How can I view course syllabi or an instructor's curriculum vitae?

Students can visit the Course Syllabus and Curriculum Vitae Online Web page (<http://www.uh.edu/policies/hb2504/students/>) for more information.

How will I know if my classes are canceled during inclement weather?

Students are encouraged to listen to any of the television and radio outlets or to check newspapers or news bureaus for information on the status of the university during a weather emergency. The Office of Media Relations will notify these outlets throughout any weather crisis to make sure the information reaches the university community in a timely manner. Special efforts will be made to ensure that the latest information on the status of the university will be in the late television news (10 p.m.) and the early morning television and radio drive-time news (5:30 a.m.).

What time are classes dismissed?

Classes are dismissed 10 minutes prior to the last time shown in the class schedule.

I don't understand what is meant by Six Week–First, Nine Week–First and Regular Summer Session–12 Week.

All summer session titles commonly associated with the Office of the University Registrar (i.e., Summer I, Summer II, Summer III and Summer IV) have different terminologies in the myUH system. These new terms are the same ones already used in the Class Search in myUH.

Email

How can I check my UH email?

Upon enrollment, students are assigned a UH email alias (<http://www.uh.edu/infotech/services/accounts/email/alias/#http://www.uh.edu/infotech/services/accounts/email/alias/index.php>). For more information about the UH email alias and how to use, please visit the UH Information Technology (<http://www.uh.edu/infotech/services/accounts/email/student-email/>) web pages.

Financial Aid

Where can I get information on UH financial incentives towards graduation?

At the Undergraduate Tuition Rebate (<http://www.uh.edu/financial/undergraduate/types-aid/incentives/tuition-rebate/>) website (<http://www.uh.edu/financial/undergraduate/types-aid/incentives/tuition-rebate/>) find out the requirements for a \$1,000 rebate at graduation: Texas residency, limit on courses taken, limit on time to graduate, etc.

When will my financial aid disburse (pay) to my account?

In order for your funds to disburse, you must:

- Accept/Decline Financial Aid Awards
- Satisfy all application and disbursement requirements listed on your To Do list under Financial Aid at myUH
- Meet the conditions of the award

Each semester financial aid will disburse (pay) to your student account during the first week of class. To check if your financial aid has been disbursed, visit your Account Summary under Finances at myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>). First-time borrowers for a Federal Direct Loan (<http://www.uh.edu/financial/undergraduate/types-aid/loans/>) may not receive their loan funds for up to 30 days after the semester begins.

If you have financial aid remaining after your tuition has been paid, UH will forward the balance to you within 72 hours. You must activate your Higher One Refund Card (<https://cougarone.higheroneaccount.com/>) and select how you would like to receive your funds:

- balance transfer to your Higher One Refund Card (<https://cougarone.higheroneaccount.com/>)
- direct deposit to your private bank account

If your financial aid is disbursed at the beginning of the semester and you reduce your number of enrolled hours within the drop/add period, your aid will be adjusted to reflect your semester registration. If your reduced enrollment results in less eligibility for aid, you will be charged for the overpayment of financial aid — creating a balance due on your UH student account.

Any past due balance will prevent future registration at UH.

How do I accept my financial aid award?

1. Log on to myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>).
2. Click UH Self-Service located at the top left-hand corner of the page.
3. Click on Financial Aid.
4. Click on Accept/Decline Awards
5. Click on the Aid Year
6. Review your award package and click Accept/Decline Awards.

Where do I view my financial aid requirements?

1. Log on to myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>).
2. Click UH Self-Service located at the top left-hand corner of the page.
3. Click on Financial Aid.
4. Click on To Do Lists to access the additional information required by our office. All financial aid forms (<http://www.uh.edu/financial/undergraduate/forms/>) are available online. As we receive the information, it will no longer be listed on the To Do List.

How can I check the status of my Financial Aid?

There are many ways to check the status of your financial aid. Your best resource is to log in to your myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>) account to look for updates. You also can call a Financial Aid customer service representative at 713-743-1010, option 3, get help online (/get-help) or stop by the Welcome Center (http://www.uh.edu/campus_map/buildings/WC.html) and sign in to speak to a Financial Aid advisor.

How do I avoid disenrollment if I receive financial aid?

- If you have **been awarded AND have accepted** your financial aid (your Account Summary screen will still show “pending financial aid”) — make sure you have paid (or selected a payment plan option (<http://www.uh.edu/admissions/financial/payment/plans/>)) for any balance remaining that your aid does not cover.
- If you have **been awarded** but have **not accepted** your financial aid — make sure you accept your award and pay (or select a payment plan option) for any balance remaining after your financial aid applies to your account.
- If you **have not yet been awarded** your financial aid, must make adequate payment or choose a payment plan option to avoid being disenrolled.

How will I be contacted by the Financial Aid office?

The Financial Aid office communicates with students via email. An email will be sent to your preferred email address in myUH. If you have not set a preferred email, then it will be sent to your UH email address. You also can check the status of your financial aid on myUH.

When does Financial Aid disburse?

Financial aid is scheduled to disburse on the first day of class. Contact the Scholarship & Financial Aid office (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/financial-aid/>) for details.

Am I going to be dropped from my classes on the fee & tuition payment deadline (<http://www.uh.edu/admissions/financial/payment/billing-due-dates>) if financial aid doesn't disburse until after the deadline?

If already you have accepted your financial aid awards, and you can see them as the anticipated aid that will cover your entire bill, then you will not be disenrolled. If your aid is packaged but does not cover the entire balance, then you are responsible for making arrangements to have the difference paid for before the fee and tuition payment deadline

(<http://www.uh.edu/admissions/financial/payment/billing-due-dates>). If you recently have been awarded your financial aid, you have received an email directly to you regarding your financial aid award and your account. If you have not been awarded your financial aid yet, you have received or will receive an email directly to you regarding your financial aid award and your account.

Where do I turn in my Hazlewood application?

All Hazlewood applications must be turned in at Welcome Center (http://www.uh.edu/campus_map/buildings/WC.html), Student Business Services Counter by 5 p.m. on the fee and tuition payment deadline (<http://www.uh.edu/admissions/financial/payment/billing-due-dates>).

myUH

How do I log in to myUH?

Go to myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>). Use myUH ID and password.

I can't access my myUH account. I enter my myUH ID, and it says that it reset my password to my account, but I haven't received that email, and it has been a couple of days.

Perhaps the email address in myUH we have for you is not accurate. The IT Help Desk in the MD Anderson Library Tech Commons (http://www.uh.edu/maps/buildings/?short_name=TCOMM) can update your email address. It will process overnight. The next day when you ask the system to reset your password, it will go to your preferred email address. Or, you can email support@uh.edu (mailto:support@uh.edu). You also may call IT support at 713-743-1411.

How do I obtain my myUH ID?

1. Visit the AccessUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu>) login page.
2. Click on "Don't know your CougarNet ID?" located in the middle of the page.
3. Follow the necessary steps to obtain your myUH ID.
4. To report problems retrieving your myUH ID, please call IT Support at 713-743-1411

Can I update my name and/or ID# in the system?

If you are a new student and not currently enrolled, you'll need to go to the Admissions Office (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/admissions/>) in the Welcome Center (http://www.uh.edu/campus_map/buildings/WC.html). If you are a currently enrolled student and have not worked for the UH System, you'll need to go to the Welcome Center Office of the University Registrar (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/registrar/>) counter. If you've been employed by the UH System, you'll need to contact the UH Human Resources Department (<http://www.uh.edu/admin/hr/>). Please note that you'll be required to complete a name change form and submit supporting documentation such as marriage license, naturalization certificate, divorce decree, etc., along with a picture ID with the new name.

Parking & Transportation

Does the University of Houston have garage parking available?

The University of Houston has state-of-the-art parking garages which provide 1,500 spaces each for students, faculty/staff, and visitors. The garages are designed with customer safety and convenience as key elements. Some features are: Equipped with 14 security cameras connected to UHDPS; Emergency call boxes (15) located throughout the facility; Enhanced lighting; Glass-enclosed elevators and stairwells for good visibility; Centralized Pay-on-Foot stations for visitors; no cashier located at exits.

Will a garage permit allow me to park in other parking lots?

Vehicles displaying a garage permit must park in the parking garage weekdays between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. They may park in student or economy lots weekdays after 5 p.m. and all day on weekends.

Can I appeal a citation I don't think I should have received?

Yes, students and faculty/staff can appeal a citation (<https://eservices.parking.uh.edu/ebusiness/cmn/auth.aspx>) in written or oral form to the PTS Program Coordinator. A citation must be paid or appealed within 21 calendar days of issuance. Some violation fines will be reduced to half price if paid within 48 hours.

What if I got a citation I don't feel that I deserve, can I ignore it?

If you got a ticket you shouldn't ignore it. If the officer made a mistake, we need to correct it. If you disagree with a ticket, appeal it (<https://eservices.parking.uh.edu/ebusiness/cmn/auth.aspx>) within 21 days. Simply saying you didn't do anything wrong or that the officer made a mistake is not sufficient.

Are citations written between sessions and holidays?

Yes, citations are written by parking enforcement assistants and the University of Houston Public Safety Department (<http://www.uh.edu/police/>) throughout the year, 24 hours a day, whether the school is in session or not. Please contact PTS for the valid dates.

Does the university participate in METRO Q-Card Program (student discounts)?

Yes, college students can receive 1/2 off of all METRO fares by using the METRO Student Q-Card, only available at METRO ride stores. The student must have a College photo ID and be able to show proof of enrollment (12+ hours for undergraduates and 9+ hours for graduate students). To learn more about the Q-Card program and the locations of METRO Ride Stores, go to METRO's website (<http://www.ridemetro.org/>) and click on the Fare Information tab.

What happens if my permit is lost or stolen?

You should immediately complete a lost/stolen report and obtain a replacement permit. The cost for a replacement permit is \$50. If a reported lost/stolen permit is found on a vehicle, the car will be immobilized (booted/towed) and the violator will be charged \$150 (\$100 use of lost/stolen permit, \$50 tow plus any other violations). Permit holders are responsible for citations issued to their permit regardless of vehicle ownership.

Is my permit transferable to other vehicles?

Yes, you can transfer your permit to another vehicle. Permits are not transferable from person to person.

How can I avoid getting a citation?

Purchase and properly display your permit. Do not park in Fire Zones or someone's reserved space. Do not park in Disabled spaces without displaying the proper permits. Park between the striped lines and don't block driving lanes. Obey timed parking zones, such as loading zones and meters. When in doubt, contact the office of Parking and Transportation Services ([/pts/](http://pts/)) or refer to the parking rules and regulation-campus map brochure.

What should I do if my parents or a friend comes to visit me on campus?

Visitors must obtain and display a temporary parking permit. Permits are available at the Information Booths (http://www.uh.edu/campus_map/buildings/INFO) at Entrance 1 or Entrance 15G.

What happens if I park for a minute or was told by a friend or professor to park in a location and I receive a citation?

If you even stay for a minute or two, your vehicle is still as illegally parked as if it had been there all day. If you are in doubt, contact Parking and Transportation Services ([/pts/](http://pts/)) for answers. A professor or friend may intend to be helpful, but they will not be responsible for the citation you receive.

How can I pay for my citation(s)?

You can pay in person at the Parking and Transportation Services ([/pts/](http://pts/)) (PTS) office, mail in your payment (envelope and bottom portion of citation) to the office or online on Citation Payment (<https://eservices.parking.uh.edu/ebusiness/cit/index.aspx>). If you pay certain citations within the first 48 hours, the fee will be reduced by 50%.

Where is Parking and Transportation Services located?

We are located in the Welcome Center (<http://www.uh.edu/welcomecenter/>), room 112B. You can call us at 713-743-1097.

Are the shuttle services free?

Yes, Parking and Transportation Services (/pts/) provides a free campus shuttle service to the campus community. Routes and times are subject to change depending on demand. So we suggest that you contact our office for the most current schedule.

Winter and Summer Mini Sessions**Enrollment Restrictions:**

The following restrictions apply to all students enrolling for a Winter or Summer Mini Session:

1. Students may not enroll in the Winter Mini Session if **Spring** is your first UH semester or the Summer Mini Session if **Summer** is your first UH semester. **Therefore, students who are currently attending another university other than UH will NOT be eligible to take the Winter Mini Session classes.**
2. Students must be in good academic standing with a UH GPA above 2.0
3. Enrollment is limited to one class (up to four hours). Only your Academic Advisor can grant permission for more than one Winter or Summer Mini Session class.

International students have the following additional restrictions for the Winter Mini Session:

1. Enrollment for the Winter or Summer Mini Session cannot be the first class ever taken at UH: International students attending UH for the first time are not eligible to enroll in the Winter or Summer Mini Session.
2. A class from the Winter or Summer Mini Session cannot be the last course needed to graduate. International students in their last semester must register for at least one class in the Regular Spring Session in addition to their Winter Mini Session enrollment.

Registration and Enrollment:**What is a Winter Mini Session class?**

Winter Mini Session classes are **Spring** classes that are being taught during the Winter Holiday Break from **the close of the Fall term until the beginning of the Spring Session 1 (regular).**

What is a Summer Mini Session class?

Summer Mini Session classes are **Summer** classes that are being taught during the break **between the close of the Spring term until the beginning of the Summer Session 1 (regular).**

How do I find and enroll in Winter or Summer Mini Session classes?

Mini Session classes will be either face-to-face on campus (with some hybrid sections) or online.

The complete list of all Winter Mini Session classes can be found under **SPRING** in the *CLASS SEARCH* option of your myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>) account. Under *CLASS SEARCH CRITERIA*, select your **Course Career** from the drop-down menu and use the *ADDITIONAL SEARCH CRITERIA* section to choose **Mini Session** from the drop-down menu.

The complete list of all Summer Mini Session classes can be found under **SUMMER** in the *CLASS SEARCH* option of your myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>) account. Under *CLASS SEARCH CRITERIA*, select your **Course Career** from the drop-down menu and use the *ADDITIONAL SEARCH CRITERIA* section to choose **Mini Session** from the drop-down menu.

What are the class formats for the Mini Session?

Mini Session classes will be either face-to-face on campus (with some hybrid sections) or online.

Will Winter Mini Session classes meet during the holidays?

Most classes will NOT have on-campus meetings from **Dec. 24, through Jan. 1**. Online classes, however, may still have assignments. Please check with your instructor for more details.

How do I find the classroom for a face-to-face Mini Session class?

The classrooms for face-to-face Mini Session classes will be displayed on the "Class Notes" section of the specific class on PeopleSoft.

How many Mini Session classes can I take?

Students are allowed to register for only one course during the Mini Session (no more than four hours). Students must have special permission from their academic advisor to enroll in more than one course.

Can I take a Mini Session course if I'm not a UH student?

No, only currently enrolled UH students are allowed to take Mini Session courses.

Can international students enroll in the Mini Session?

International students can enroll in a Mini Session class under the following conditions:

1. Enrollment for the Mini Session cannot be the first class ever taken at UH: International students attending UH for the first time are not eligible to enroll in the Mini Session.
2. A class from the Mini Session cannot be the last course needed to graduate. International students in their last semester must register for at least one class in the Regular Spring Session in addition to their Winter Mini Session enrollment.

When can I enroll in the Mini Session?

Students can enroll in Winter Mini Session and/or **Spring** classes through the myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>) self-service account during the dates listed on your myUH enrollment appointment schedule. Open registration will be listed when announced.

Students can enroll in Summer Mini Session and/or **Summer** classes through the myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>) self-service account during the dates listed on your myUH enrollment appointment schedule. Open registration will be listed when announced.

Please view the **Enrollment Schedule** (<http://www.uh.edu/academics/courses-enrollment/enrollment-schedule/>) for specific classification enrollment schedules.

When is the last day to add a Mini Session class?

Please refer to the Academic Calendar (<http://www.uh.edu/academic-calendar-undergraduate>) for the last day to add, The dates are listed session-specific.

Do the undergraduate policies (e.g., 6 W Rule, Enrollment Cap, etc.) apply for classes taken during the Mini Session?

Yes.

How do I drop a face-to-face Mini Session class?**Undergraduate Students:**

- To drop without a grade must be done by **the last day to drop or withdraw without receiving a grade**, specifically noted on the academic calendar.
- To drop with a 'W' students must process the drop by **Last day to drop a course or withdraw with a 'W'**, specifically noted on the academic calendar.

Please Note: Undergraduates who have reached their **6 W** (<http://www.uh.edu/provost/policies/student/#2>) grades limit must complete all classes.

Graduate Students:

Graduate Students must complete a drop form.

- Pick up a Student Initiated Drop form from any academic department or online form the Graduate School website (<http://www.uh.edu/graduate-school/forms/>). *A separate form is required for each course to be dropped.*
- Complete the form in its entirety and sign it. Obtain course instructor's signature.
- Submit the completed form to the Office of the University Registrar service desk in the Welcome Center (<http://www.uh.edu/about/offices/enrollment-services/>) by **5:00 p.m.** close of business on the drop due date.

** Students should continue to attend the class until the drop is visible in your myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>) self-service account.*

How do I drop an online Mini Session class?**Undergraduate Students:**

To drop an online class, follow the same drop procedure for a face-to-face class.

Log into your myUH (<https://accessuh.uh.edu/login.php>) account to drop your course online.

- To drop without a grade must be done by **the last day to drop or withdraw without receiving a grade**, specifically noted on the academic calendar.
- To drop with a 'W' students must process the drop by the **last day to drop a course or withdraw with a 'W'**, specifically noted on the academic calendar.

Please Note: Undergraduates who have reached their **6 W** (<http://www.uh.edu/provost/policies/student/#2>) grades limit must complete all classes.

Graduate Students:

- Students should email their instructors with the request to drop, and copy the Office of Educational Outreach at DEservices@uh.edu (<mailto:DEservices@uh.edu>). The request must include the student's name, PeopleSoft number, the class name, class number and the instructor's name.
- Instructors should "Reply All" with their acknowledgment of the drop.
- Drop forms will be completed by the Office of Educational Outreach and submitted to the Office of University Registrar.

- To drop without a grade must be done by **the last day to drop or withdraw without receiving a grade**, specifically noted on the academic calendar.
- To drop with a 'W,' students must process the drop by the **last day to drop a course or withdraw with a 'W'**, specifically noted on the academic calendar.

Please Note: Requests and Acknowledgements MUST be received by the Office of Educational Outreach by **5:00 p.m.** on the drop date. **NO LATE DROPS WILL BE PROCESSED.**

Costs and Financial Aid:**What can I expect to pay in tuition and fees if I enroll in one Mini Session undergraduate class?**

Mini Sessions classes cost the same as comparable classes during the regular fall, spring and summer terms; however, please note that college and course fees vary.

There will be an additional charge for Student Insurance for the Mini Session.

What are required fees and how are they handled for the Mini Session?

Required fees for the Mini Session are assessed with the first enrollment in the session and are in addition to the cost of tuition.

Students registered in a Mini Session course **and** a regular term class will pay required fees for the regular term. Students registered only in a Mini Session class also will pay required fees for the regular term.

Why are my Winter Mini Session tuition and fees being put on my Spring fee bill?

Winter Mini Session courses are officially considered part of the **Spring** term. Therefore, Winter Mini Session class tuition and fees will be posted on the **Spring** term fee bill.

What is the refund policy regarding withdrawing from Mini Session classes?

Withdrawal means dropping **all** enrolled courses in a single semester.

For example, a student who enrolls in a Winter Mini Session class and a Spring class is enrolled for **one** single semester (**Spring**).

What is the refund policy regarding dropping from Mini Session classes?

If the student drops a Winter Mini Session class and maintains enrollment in the **Spring** term, the student has **not** withdrawn from all courses in the term.

How does a *current* student enroll for class at the University of Houston?

The Dean of Students Office recommends that all students (both those new to the University and those who are currently attending) meet with their Academic Advisor (<http://www.uh.edu/provost/stu/advisorlist.html>) before enrolling for the next semester. After meeting with their Advisor (<http://www.uh.edu/provost/stu/advisorlist.html>), students can register within myUH (<http://my.uh.edu/>).

How many courses can or should an undergraduate student take a semester?

An undergraduate student should recognize that course work in college will require a significant amount of work outside the classroom - traditionally recommended at 2-3 hours for every hour in class. Click here to find out more about the University's course load recommendations. (<http://catalog.uh.edu/content.php?catoid=9&navoid=1621>)

Does a student have to declare a major right away? What if my son/daughter doesn't know what he/she wants to major in?

No, students do not have to declare a major right away. Students who choose not to declare a major at the point of admission to the University of Houston will be offered assistance through UScholars (<http://www.uh.edu/ussc/exploratorystudies/>) that will help them later make an informed decision about a major field of study. All UScholars students must declare a major by the beginning of their junior year (60 credit hours), if they have not already done so.

May I check my student's grades online?

Students can log into myUH (<http://my.uh.edu/>) under the Academic Record tab students can view and print their grades and check their current grade point average. We encourage you to have a conversation with your student about how they will share this information. FERPA, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, is a federal law regarding the privacy of student records and the access provided to these records. Unless your student has provided written authorization specifically identifying what information may be released to you as the parent, you may not have access to his or her records, such as grades and test scores.

My student is not doing well academically, is there tutoring available on campus?

The University of Houston offers outstanding resources free of charge for students seeking academic assistance. LAUNCH—Learning Advancements for UNdergraduate Cougars of Houston (<http://www.uh.edu/ussc/launch/>) offer tutoring services, learning strategies counseling and workshops on academic learning strategies and personal development. The Writing Center (<http://www.uh.edu/writecen/>) offers one-on-one consultation and more to help your students gain confidence in their writing ability.

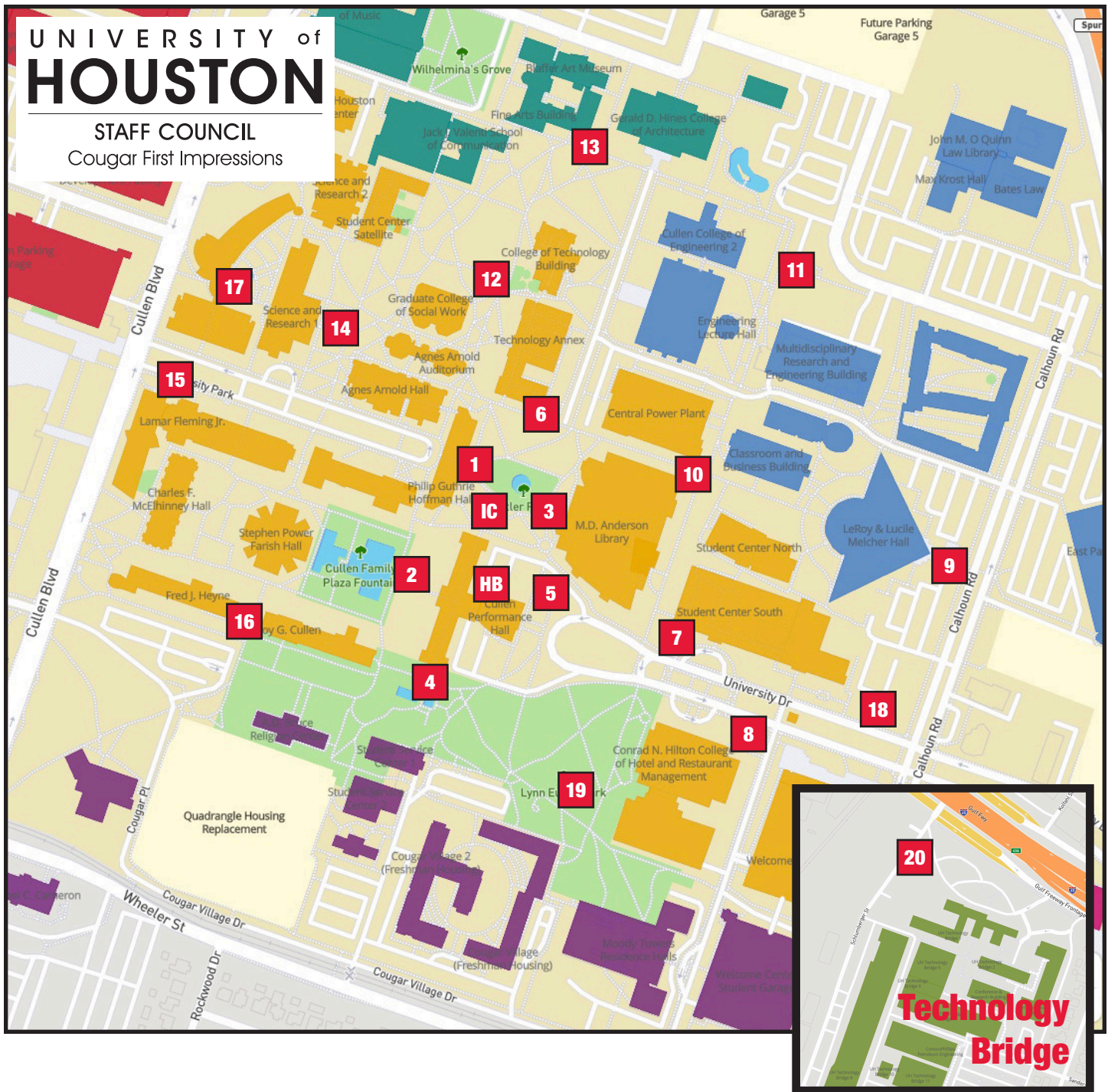

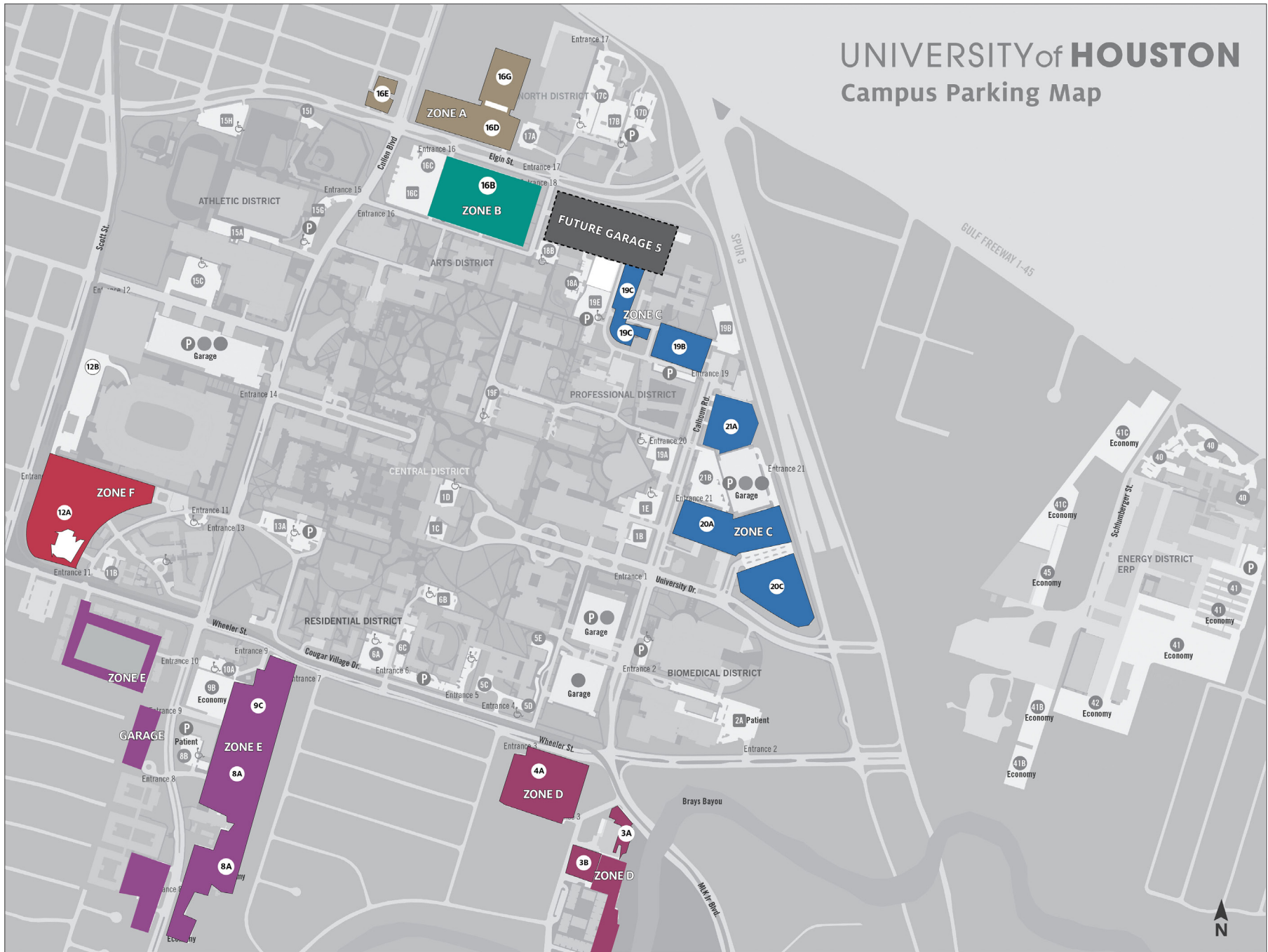

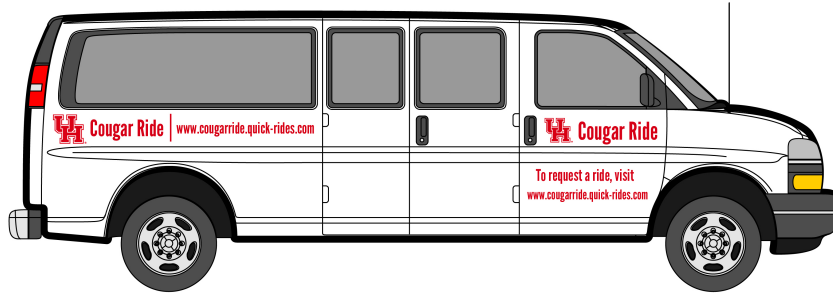
