Proposal for a Minor in Jewish Studies

The Jewish Studies Program takes a broad interdisciplinary and multidimensional approach to the global study of Jews, exploring the rich diversity of their cultures, their philosophies, their religious practices, their histories, their roles in politics, and other areas of contemporary life.

This 18-hour interdisciplinary minor offers students the opportunity study the key elements shaping the Jewish experience (religion, ethnicity, history, culture, nationality, art, and literature) and are essential to understanding today's complex and diverse society. Jewish Studies introduces students not only to the theory behind these concepts but also to how they shape everyday lives.

In addition to the minor, the Jewish Studies Program will promote activities such as speakers, conferences, films, and cultural events relating Jewish Studies for students, faculty, and the Houston community as well as encouraging participation in study abroad programs for students and faculty.

The minor in Jewish Studies consists of the following 18 hour requirement:
