Major name change in B. S. in Interdisciplinary Studies

The College of Education seeks a name change for the Major Interdisciplinary Studies.

Presently, students pursuing careers in elementary or middle school teaching declare the degree of Bachelor of Science and the single major (plan) of Interdisciplinary Studies, rather than a major with a title more recognizable to teaching. The major name causes all sorts of trouble--students who want to teach don't know which degree to select because they are looking for something that sounds like teaching, and students who don't want to teach inadvertently declare our major, thinking it is something more like Liberal Studies. Consequently, our undergraduate retention numbers in the College suffer as students figure out the mistake and change their majors.

There is a history to this particular degree name, which is a common degree name at teacher preparation programs throughout Texas. Legislation passed in 1987 requires a person who applies for a teaching certificate to possess a degree with an academic major or an interdisciplinary academic major including reading, other than education, related to the public school curriculum. That same year the Coordinating Board eliminated degrees with the words "education" and "teaching" in the title, i.e., Bachelor of Science in Education and Bachelor of Arts in Teaching. The board also eliminated majors with the "education" in the name, i.e., Social Science Education.

However, knowing what a challenge the degree name has presented for us, we recently sought clarification on our options with the State Board for Educator Certification. We learned that the coordinating board action did not eliminate majors with the word "teaching" in the title. We were told that to provide clarification for students, yet still fit within the law of the state, we could have a degree title of Bachelor of Science with a major in, for example, Elementary Teaching and Curriculum.

We, therefore, seek to change the current Interdisciplinary Studies majors/plans to the majors 1) Elementary Teaching and Curriculum and 2) Middle School Teaching and Curriculum. Under those majors will remain the more specific subplans (e.g., science 4-8 or EC-6 Bilingual Generalist).

Attached is a lit of specific CIP codes included in this proposed major name change.

Below is the specific catalog Language for Bachelor of Science with Majors in 1) Elementary Teaching and Curriculum; 2) Elementary Bilingual Teaching and Curriculum; 3) Elementary Teaching and Curriculum with Special Education; and 4) Middle School Teaching and Curriculum

Students seeking elementary (EC-6 Generalist, EC-6 Bilingual Generalist, or EC-6/EC-12 Special Education) teaching certification will complete the requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Elementary Teaching and Curriculum; students seeking middle school (4-8 English/Language Arts, 4-8 Math, 4-8 Science, 4-8 Social Studies) teaching certification will complete the requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Middle School Teaching and Curriculum. Students should seek an academic advisor to begin taking coursework according to the Pre-Teaching plan. Freshmen and transfer students without an earned UH GPA should declare as "Pre-Pre-Teaching" in order to earn a UH GPA of at least 2.5, as well as to meet other required benchmark requirements, prior to declaring a major in Elementary or Middle School Teaching and Curriculum.

The majors in Elementary and Middle School Teaching and Curriculum are composed of five components: academic foundations, pre-professional development courses, specific B.S. and Coordinating Board requirements for mathematics and science, and the Professional Development Sequence (QUEST). This degree requires 121-133 semester hours. Degree outlines are available online at www.coe.uh.edu/about/quest/.

If you are interested in declaring a Teaching and Curriculum major, you should make an appointment with an advisor in the Office of Undergraduate Studies in the College of Education. The advisor will answer your questions and concerns, review the requirements for the major, alert you to important milestones and deadlines, and assist you to sketch out a curriculum plan, based on University-wide Core Curriculum choices, and College of Education guidelines. Most important, the advisor will explain when you may file a Degree Plan for majoring in Elementary or Middle School Teaching and Curriculum.
